Delegate's Report

Hello!

Our first Assembly of the 2010-2012 term was fantastic, wasn't it? I really appreciated the positive energy and sense of cooperation over the weekend as we met the challenges of navigating in our fine new location.

In February, I had the pleasure of attending the SE Regional Delegates Get-Together, an informal gathering of current and past delegates in our region. I got to know 4 other new delegates, so there will be some familiar faces for me among many new ones at the World Service Conference (WSC) in April. One of the highlights of the weekend was a presentation given by JP, our own SE Regional Trustee.

Two agenda items have been chosen for one-hour discussions each at the WSC. I would like to invite your input on these topics to better help me represent Georgia AI-Anon. Please e-mail me with any comments you may have by April 1st at valpcw@cs.com:

1: a) "What do we do when members holding service positions are unable to effectively do the tasks of the position, and these deficits are negatively impacting the Area and potentially AI-Anon as a whole? How do we balance 'being willing to serve' and possessing 'necessary skills and talents' to be effective?" b) "How can we get 'new people' (defined as current and longtime AI-Anon members, as well as newcomers) interested in service and to become willing to commit to service positions at the group, district, and Area levels?"

2: a) "How can the members of the WSC develop an effective strategy that would bring AI-Anon Family Groups into the communities and cultures of specific minorities in the U.S. and Canada? If we are effective in reaching minority communities, what actions as a fellowship to ensure that they remain as active members?" b) "Can we find effective and practical ways to make it easier for non-English-speaking members to participate in AI-Anon service at the Area level and beyond?"

Background note: Since the majority of AI-Anon members are older Caucasian females, 'minority communities' would include race, inmates in prisons, sexual orientation, members of AA, men, etc. One concern is that the literature intended to reach out to diverse groups is not effectively used in direct outreach to these communities.

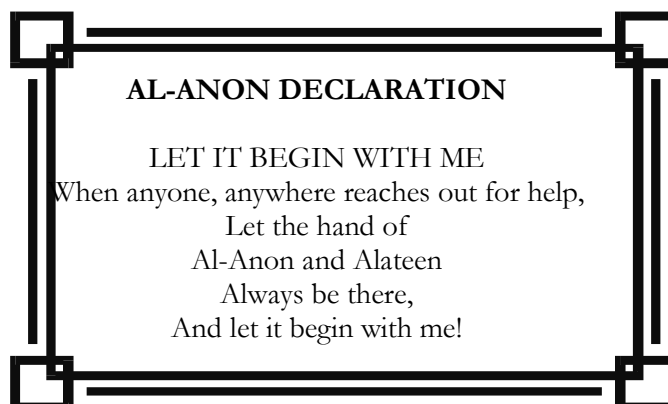

♥ *Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism 2010* is currently available through WSO as well MAIS. For those unfamiliar with the piece of CAL, its purpose is to help the individual find their way to an Al-Anon meeting. WSO is encouraging **every member of every group** to leave a copy of AFA 2010 somewhere. It was also suggested that a label with some sort of contact information such as the GA Al-Anon website (<http://www.ga-al-anon.org>) or the WSO telephone number (757)563-1600, and perhaps a copy of *Have You Been Affected By Someone Else's Drinking?*. Both pieces of CAL are available through WSO and MAIS.

♥ “When Love is not Enough”, the Lois Wilson story, will air on CBS television on Sunday, April 25, 2010 at 9 pm Eastern time. The movie, starring Wyonna Rider, shares the story of Lois, her life with Bill (co-founder of AA), and how she decided to work the 12 Steps in her life. The impact the airing this 90-minute Hallmark movie will have on folks may be monumental.

It's quite possible that there will be a number of newcomers, who, having viewed the movie, will want to try our program. Each group, therefore, is encouraged to have plenty of literature available. Individual group members might want to take advantage of the broadcast and “forget” literature in libraries, medical offices, post offices, police stations, AA/Al-Anon Clubhouses, domestic violence shelters, and any other location where you feel led. Having general Al-Anon contact information on the literature might “carry the message” even further. Hallmark is expected to have copies of “When Love is not Enough” for purchase on DVD.

Please understand that this report is not to promote the movie, but rather to be sensitive to the fact that it will increase awareness of our program. In keeping with our Traditions, we cooperated with Hallmark and remain unaffiliated.

Maybe the most important thing I have recognized this year is the true importance of living one day at a time. It is so easy to pay lip service to that slogan but two huge happenings in my life have really brought that phrase home and have made me practice one day at a time on a more basic level than I do on a regular basis.

My sweet son-in-law's mother is battling a very serious lung cancer that has moved on to other areas of the body. Even though she is doing very well in her treatment and has the most inspiring attitude I have witnessed with someone in her particular fight, our whole family has come together to enjoy every moment we have together. No one is taking anything for granted and we have all supported each other in loving her and sharing as much time as we can. It has been a blessing to see our family come together in this principle. Thank you, God.

Of course the other huge opportunity for growth has been sending our son off to Iraq for his deployment in the Infantry. None of my worst fears have materialized since he has been there since September and I can look back now in retrospect and see how God must have been laughing at my worries.
